Petitioner above named

Most Respectfully Sheweth:

1. That your petitioners are permanent citizens of India and are
permanent residents of the address given in the cause title above,
where they reside.



2. That the petitioner No. 1 had written to the Respondent No. 3 and 6 to 8 inter alia stating that "I, Areka Sarkar D/O Late Kartick Chandra Sarkar permanently residing at 601, R.R. Plot, Anandapur, Kolkata - 700107 would like to inform you that after the death in July 16, 2017 of my father I along with my mother Santi Rani Sarkar and my brother Kaushik Sarkar were his legal heirs. Thus, accordingly we had converted our flat at the aforementioned address in our respective names. As per my knowledge the Kolkata Municipal Corporation had issued each of us tax bills. However, gradually my mother started forcing me to get married to man of her choice while my brother was insisting that I would transfer my share of the property in his name. As I often used to refuse to his illegitimate demand I used to be severely assaulted by both of them. My mother knew that I was having some affection towards a friend of mine namely Joyshree Das. This said fact was unacceptable to my family members. I repeatedly tried to explain to them about my choice, I even went on to make it clear that I am an adult and I am well aware of my choices. The matter escalated beyond control in September 2018 after the



verdict of the constitutional bench of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India where the Supreme Court had expressed its opinion about Section 377 of the Indian Penal Code. Various news media had discussed about the said judgement, hearing this my family members were petrified. My brother went on to say that he wouldn't hesitate to resort to honour killing if I do not get marry a man of their choice. With a heavy heart I must say that my brother wanted to rape me by saying that this would make me understand how a relationship with a man would be like. The matter had escalated so much that i was forced to flee from my house in the fear of my life. My family members are also regularly calling up Joyshree and her ailing mother. They have even threatened her of dire consequences. My brother told her that he would murder her in such a fashion that would appear to look like an accident. After such incident I am devastated. My mother has very strong connection with the local politicians and higher police officials. At present my valuable documents such as documents of my house, tax bills, ration card, my father's death certificate etc. Are lying at the said premises but I am unable to enter and take



back the same. I would request you to kindly help me to recover those documents and also take necessary action.”


A copy of the said letter of complaint dated May 16, 2019 is annexed as Annexure P1.

3. The said incidence was informed to the Respondent No. 8 to 10 in terms of Sections 154 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 by way of speed post and a letter on May 16, 2019. A copy of the postal receipt and the track report are collectively annexed as Annexure P2.
4. That it is owing to the fact that the petitioner No.1 had expressed to the private respondents her unwillingness to marry as man, for which the private respondents have become furious and it is feared that they would take extreme steps including that of eliminating both the petitioners in order to protect their family prestige.
5. That it is pertinent to point out that after the Hon'ble Supreme Court had expressed it's verdict regarding the scope of Section 377 of the Indian Penal Code, whereby the Hon'ble Court had even used the strong words that history owes these people an apology, had caused many persons to become upset and even question the

wisdom of the highest Court of the Country, of which the private respondents are no exceptions.

6. That your petitioners are adult persons and they are perfectly capable of taking their own decisions. The private respondents have tried to make a mockery of the process of law by threatening to go the police and harassing them. Infact on previous occasions the private respondents even stated they have links with high ups in the police department.
7. That your petitioners are afraid that no investigation has been carried out, and such an inaction shows a very casual and careless approach though the letter of complaint clearly reflects the elements of various other serious offences.
8. That it is submitted that when the state effectively was served with a notice and yet no endeavour was made to protect the your petitioner or the victims. There was neither any effort to apprehend the accused persons. Such a careless attitude of the state make out a case for the interference of this Hon'ble Court.




9. The letter of complaint clearly reflects a cognizable offence and an extremely daring attitude of the miscreants but it is very shocking to find that there was no action taken and neither was any FIR lodged after that.
 10. Owing to their sexual identity Your Petitioners have to confront various difficult situations including the fact that they were ridiculed as well as awkward situations have been created which grossly disrupted her basic human dignity.
 11. The very fact an innocent person was tortured mere owing to their sexual orientation, and inspite lodging a complaint, no action has been taken, is a huge question as to the law and order situation and such an offence is certainly which shakes the consciousness of a man of ordinary prudence.
 12. The very fact that no action has been taken till date speaks for itself. Though a considerable period of time has elapsed yet no FIR was registered. Such a conduct clearly show the casual approach by the investigating agency.

13. The petitioner submits that the inaction on the part of the respondent in not replying to the representations made by the petitioner lay bare the want of reasonableness in their conduct.
14. That the petitioners submit that the acts, inactions and deeds of the respondents concerned have grossly violated the petitioner's rights guaranteed under Articles 14 and 21 of the Constitution of India.
15. That the petitioner submits that the respondents has adopted a biased and partisan approach in dealing with the case of the petitioner and as such have thrust great hardship upon him and such acts and deeds of the concerned respondents are violative of the rules of justice, equity and fair play.
16. That the petitioner submits that the acts of the respondents concerned are also violative of the principles of Natural Justice and in particular, the principle, which provides that the act of an authority, whether judicial, quasi-judicial or administrative, must be just, fair, reasonable and bona fide.




17. Upon being extremely dissatisfied and aggrieved by the inaction of the respondents in having a very casual approach to the law and order situation and the non consideration of the letter of complaint, as well as the fact that your petitioner and the victims of the offence are living in fear and anxiety, your petitioner begs to move this application under Article 226 of the Constitution of India on following amongst other:-

Grounds

- I. For that the action of the authority concerned is perverse, per se bad and unconstitutional;
 - II. For that the authority concerned did not take into consideration the representation, Annexure P1, made by the petitioner;
 - III. For that the authority concerned acted in a manner which was contrary to the procedure established by law;
 - IV. For that the authority concerned in denying to discharge their duty by considering the representation made by the
- 

petitioner, have acted in a manner which abrogated the most cardinal principle of Natural Justice;

- V. For that the letter of complaint clearly reflects a cognizable offence and an extremely daring attitude of the miscreants but it is very shocking to find that there was no action taken and neither was any FIR lodged after that.
 - VI. For that the state respondent has failed to investigate the case in a quick and expeditious manner and it further failed to execute it's duty when the complainant was threatened with of dire consequences;
 - VII. For that acts and deeds of the authority concerned indicate a biased and partisan approach of the respondents in dealing with the case of the petitioner;
 - VIII. For that the respondents have failed to treat your petitioner with dignity by willfully not replying to the representation made by your petitioner;
 - IX. For that the Investigating Agency has caused the investigation in a casual and careless manner;
- 


X. For that the actions of the Private respondents in not allowing the petitioners to reside peacefully is causing the petitioners and immense prejudice;

XI. For that the petitioner submits that the acts, inactions and deeds of the respondents concerned have grossly violated the petitioner's rights guaranteed under Articles 14 and 21 of the Constitution of India.

XII. For that the private respondent has acted in manner which would shake the consciousness of an ordinary person and even they are continuing their acts of atrocity on a regular basis;

18. That the petitioner states that in the facts and circumstances stated hereinabove, he has made out a strong prima - facie case which warrants judicial review.

19. That the balance of convenience and/or inconvenience rests in favour of the petitioner for grant of reliefs as prayed for hereinafter and such reliefs, if granted, would provide adequate remedy to the petitioner.



20. That the petitioner shall suffer irreparable loss, injury and prejudice if orders as prayed for hereinafter are not granted.


21. That the petitioner has not approached any other Court or any other forum seeking redressal of the self-same cause of action.

22. This application is bonafide and made in the interest of justice.

And your petitioner as in duty bound shall ever pray.

In the facts and circumstances stated hereinabove, The Lordships may be graciously pleased to pass the following orders and/or directions -

a) A writ of and/or in the nature of Mandamus do issue directing the respondent no. 8 directing him to consider the representation dated May 16, 2019(which is annexed as P/1 herein) and take necessary action pursuant to consideration of such representation;




b) A writ of and/or in the nature of Mandamus do issue directing the respondent no. 8 and its officials to act according to law and cause the protection of the petitioners and the witnesses without any delay whatsoever;

c) A writ of Certiorari do issue directing the respondent authorities to transmit all records pertaining to the cases made out against the private respondents so that conscionable justice may be rendered;

d) Rule NISI in terms of prayers (a),(b), and (c) , hereinabove;

e) An interim order of injunction do issue directing the respondents Ad-interim order in terms of clause (e) hereinabove;



f) Leave to move this Hon'ble Court ex parte, without serving any notice other side prayer "E".

g) To grant leave to here this petition upon the grave urgency before the vacation bench of this Hon'ble Court.

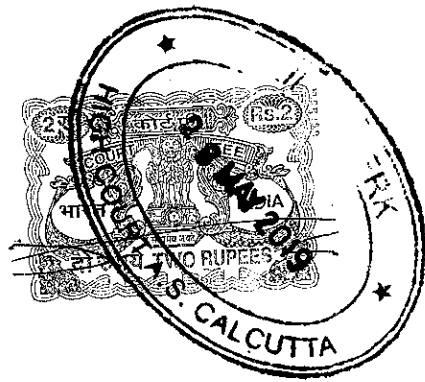
h) Costs and incidentals thereto;

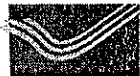
